Projected enrollment in the entry-to-practice program is 48 students with the addition of the second cohort in 2025. The degree advancement program is projected to enroll up to 55 full and part-time students after a three-year ramp-up period. The program will award a Master of Respiratory Care degree. The faculty member will be part of a dynamic team developing curriculum, program policies, and procedures and will provide didactic and clinical instruction to students enrolled in the Program on two campuses and online. They will build and sustain community partnerships in support of clinical education and outreach activities and will assist the program director with the day-to-day administration of the program, including recruiting, admissions, and advising processes.

- Excellent human relations and effective communication skills.
- Qualities conducive to establishing and maintaining effective relationships with clinicians, and coworkers in a small office setting, and community.
